

INVITATION TO BID LISLE PARK DISTRICT

Sealed bids for the 1925 Ohio Street renovation project will be accepted by the Lisle Park District, 1825 Short Street, Lisle, IL 60532 until 3:00 pm on Friday, March 18, 2011, at which time they will be publicly opened and read.

Bid documents will be available from the Lisle Park District beginning at 10 am on Friday, March 4, 2011 and then between the hours of 8:30 am and 5:00 pm Monday through Friday. A \$25 non-refundable deposit for a set of plans on a compact disc is required at the time of pick up.

A mandatory pre-bid meeting will be held on Friday, March 11, 2011 at 3:00 p.m. at the Lisle Park District administrative offices, 1825 Short Street, Lisle, Illinois.

Each bid must be placed in a sealed envelope marked "Lisle Park District, 1925 Ohio Street Renovation Project. DO NOT OPEN", and addressed to the Lisle Park District, 1825 Short Street, Lisle, Illinois 60532. Attention: Aaron Cerutti. Bids will be opened at 2:00 p.m. on Friday, March 18, 2011; bids received after that time will be rejected.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check, cashier's check or bid bond payable to the Lisle Park District in the amount of 10% of the total bid amount. Prior to construction, the winning bidder is required to provide a performance bond and labor and material payment bond payable to the Lisle Park District for not less than 100% of the total contract amount. Such bonds shall include a provision guaranteeing the faithful performance of the Prevailing Wage Act.

The Lisle Park District reserves the right to waive all technicalities and to accept or reject any or all bids. Bids shall not include federal excise tax or state sales tax. An Exemption Certificate will be furnished by the park district at the request of the bidder. All bids will remain firm for 60 days after the bid opening.

All contracts for work herein must adhere to all elements of the Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/1-12).

Minority business firms are encouraged to submit bids, and all bidders are encouraged to utilize minority businesses as subcontractors for supplies, equipment, services, and construction.
