Volunteer to Help Restore the DuPage River

Lisle, IL – Join the fun of the 25th Annual DuPage River Sweep while enjoying the outdoors on the morning of Saturday, May 21. Make a difference in the quality and appearance of waterways in Lisle and its neighboring communities.

Volunteers are needed Saturday, May 21, from 9:00am-12:00pm noon to help remove debris and restore areas near streams of the DuPage River and its tributaries. Since 1991, over 10,800 volunteers have participated in this annual clean-up and removed nearly 3,252 tons of trash. In 2015, a record was set by 600 volunteers who cleared debris over 95 miles of shoreline, removing items such as a car bumper, tricycle, no-parking sign, shopping cart and 40 golf balls. With your involvement this year, more creeks, tributaries and riverways will be cleaner and healthier!

Enjoy exercising outdoors while removing potential hazards for river wildlife, improving water flow through the county, and alleviating potential flood hazards. If picking up trash isn't quite your bag, then help restore natural areas near waterways by removing invasive plant species, such as buckthorn, garlic mustard, honeysuckle and multiflora rose.
