

Originally built in the early 1980's, Tate Woods Park has served us well and with some much-needed and sought-after improvements, it will continue to be a recreational hub of our community. In the design rendering to the right, you will notice Tate Woods Park will soon be home to six pickleball courts. As demand for this sport continues to skyrocket, the Lisle Park District is proud to allocate space and funding for more courts. ### LISLE COMMUNITY PARK

4 tennis courts resurfaced

### ARBOR VIEW PARK

Began and completed renovations to Arbor View Park

### **INCREASE IN REGISTRATIONS**

Processed 20,584 registrations as of August 30 during the first full year of the district's new registration system, CivicRec (increase of 27% from all of last year)

### SUMMER ENTERTAINMENT SERIES

Hosted 2nd annual July 3 concerts and fireworks at the Van Kampen Stage in Community Park in conjunction with the Village of Lisle, as well as four other free summer concerts

### OAK REGENERATION PROJECT

Received the Jane Fousler Habitat Award and the Chicago Region Trees Initiative Urban Forestry Award

### NAPERVILLE KAYAK PARTNERSHIP

Partnered with Naperville Kayak to offer kayak and paddleboard rentals in Community Park on the weekends throughout the summer season

### ASPEN PARK

Existing tennis court resurfaced and lined for both tennis and pickleball (2022)

### FITNESS TRAIL

Installed fitness trail in Community Park (donations received exceeded \$10,000)

### COMMUNITY PARK BALL FIELD #5

Completed renovations to Community Park Ballfield #5 for improved drainage, playability, and spectator access

### **NEW RESPONSIVE PARK DISTRICT WEBSITES**

Launched 6 new park district responsive websites including Lisle Park District, Community Park Fitness, Sea Lion Aquatic Park, The Museums at Lisle Station Park, Senior Center, Gentle Learning Preschool

### SUMMER CAMPS

2,322 campers took part in the 2023 summer camp offerings (increase of 58% from pre-pandemic levels and 22% increase from 2022). Camps include Gentle Learning Summer Camp, Camp Summer Quest, Creation Academy Art Camp and No Name Teen Camp.

### GENTLE LEARNING PRESCHOOL

Gentle Learning Preschool kicked off the 2023-2024 school year with 124 little learners. New this year, curriculum has been enhanced with the addition of an interactive SMART BOARD™ in each classroom.
